



## FLUOR CANADA CONSTRUCTION SCHOLARSHIP

*This award was created by Fluor Canada to support a Centennial construction student enrolling in a full-time Canadian Post-Secondary construction trade program or one related to the construction industry (such as civil/structural engineering, engineering technology, architecture).*

<b>WHERE TENABLE:</b>	Centennial High School
<b>FIELD OF STUDY:</b>	Construction (construction trade program <b>or</b> one related to the construction industry (such as civil/structural engineering, engineering technology, architecture)).
<b>VALUE:</b>	\$1,000
<b>NUMBER:</b>	One
<b>ELIGIBILITY:</b>	Open to students enrolled in a Grade 12 Construction course who are completing the requirements of a high school diploma.

Applicants must have received a construction teacher recommendation and have grades appropriate to their chosen post secondary course. Applicants must have made or are making positive contributions to the community or school through service or extracurricular activities, embodying a well-rounded nature.

Applicants must also submit an essay/statement of approximately 500 words explaining their post-secondary plans and interest in a construction field as a career path.

Consideration may also be given to students demonstrating financial need; students with financial need should provide a separate “statement of financial need” explaining their financial situation/circumstances.

<b>APPLY:</b>	Students can apply by creating an account in EducationMatters’ <a href="#">Student Award Application Portal</a> . Applicants should check with their guidance office for more information and are encouraged to discuss their application with the Scholarship Coordinator at their high school.
<b>SELECTION &amp; PAYMENT:</b>	Recipients will be notified by September. The selection committee shall be made up of Centennial staff including a representative from EducationMatters. To claim the award, the recipient must be registered in an eligible program of post-secondary study in Canada in the Fall of 2026. Payments are made to the post-secondary institution upon proof of registration.
