Knowledge and Employability Certificate of Achievement Requirements

You will notice that students require 5 credits in:

- 30-level KAE Workplace practicum course OR
- 30-level Work Experience course OR
- 30-level Green Certificate course OR
- Special Projects 30

Students will also complete HCS 3000, a 1-credit course that serves as a pre-requisite course for Work Experience. As part of their learning pathway and as a requirement for their Certificate of Achievement, students need to find a paid position, or a volunteer position or take part in a program at an organization such as The Ability Hub. Securing this Work Experience placement is the responsibility of the student and their parents. Once secured, our Work Experience coordinator, Mrs. Erika Seely, will visit and support the students at their work sites. It is not the responsibility of the school staff to secure positions for students in order to meet the Work Experience requirement for the Certificate of Achievement.
